



The venture utilizes overlooked centuries-old traditional African skincare rituals and ingredients to create innovative healthy skincare products.





A developmental and funding opportunity for WashU research teams that exposes them to industry professionals.

Fall 2020 LEAP Funded Teams received a combined total of \$400,000:

- AIR Seal: a multi-purpose seal for aerosol-blocking, intubation, and respiration
- Device and system for **preventing the** development of pressure ulcers
- **EnhanceAR-Seq**: a liquid biopsy approach to personalize prostate cancer treatment
- Flame-assisted additive manufacturing (FLAAM)
- Imaging tools for the early detection of kidney disease
- A safe, attenuated Zika virus (ZIKV) to treat brain tumors
- SonoBiopsy: improving molecular diagnosis of brain diseases by targeted sound

### **Diversity and Inclusion**
